April 4th Fun Float by Robert Osmoud



The April Spring Springer Event came off without a hitch. The day was sunny but cool.

There were only 4 contestants, **Robert Wickham, Alan Wing, David White, and me, Robert Osmond.** There would have been more Springers competing if so many skippers had not had scheduling conflicts. As it was there was one group of contestants.

The event consisted of leaving the starting line then proceeding past a buoy and then pushing a 5-gallon bucket which held two bricks and 3 gallons of water and a short flag pole. The captains needed to

push the bucket to the first gate then stop their Springer before it went through the gate, which allowed the bucket to continue its forward motion through the gate and beyond. After backing away from the bucket the Springer had to go around either side of the gate and begin pushing the bucket to the next gate. After completing the same maneuver at the second gate the skippers steered for the start/finish line.

I was the winner, though I am not quite sure how I won by such a large margin.

Dave and Alan could have been sandbagging so they would not win and have to put on the next Springer event. The event gave skippers practice pushing an object with significant resistance, and then using the objects inertia to make the bucket continue through the gate.

About the "interesting times:' As you all know, the Downtown Park is going to be closed for reconstruction for a year, starting in July. But exactly what this means is not clear. Dave Green and Robert Osmond have made it their business to discover the exact plan for these activities. It seems that for some of this year the pond might be available for our use. Or not. We just don't know. So we have to be flexible, and have alternative sites to run when the pond is not usable. Club members have suggested using Lake Ballinger, Beaver Lake on the Sammamish Plateau, Martha Lake, Steele Lake in Federal Way, even Lake Washington parks. We'll just have to be flexible and keep checking the web site for the latest instructions.

I personally have strong objections to what is being done to parking at Downtown Park. The city will begin by tearing out all the parking on the southeast corner, the lot that we are now using. They will also tear out the lot on the northwest. This will remove virtually all parking at the park, making it into a private park for the owners of the expensive condos that surround it. This action disenfranchises 99% of Bellevue residents, the ones that are paying for the park. Without parking spaces, they can't use the park. I am violently against this. I'll see what we can do about this.
