HOBBY EXPO IS COMING

Hobby Expo at Monroe Fairgrounds January 25th – 26th

The dates for Hobby Expo are fast approaching. Again this year we plan to have Kevin Locke's pond to demonstrate our models. We will have a nearby booth and hope to have lots of models on and off the water for Expo attendees to enjoy. Junior skippers will be scheduled to allow the youngsters to test their piloting skills with the popular Noodle Boats.

The hours of the event are shorter this year as the Friday schedule has been eliminated. The hours of the show are:

SaturdayJanuary 25th9 am to 6 pmSundayJanuary 26th9 am to 5 pm

As in the past, we plan to have junior skipper boast running on Saturday, scheduled for 30 minutes every 2 hours. The Noodle boats are great for this event, if you have one be sure and bring it. Others can bring some of your slower and less pretty boats to share with them.

IT IS IMPORTANT THAT WE HAVE LOTS OF MEMBERS ON HAND TO RUN BOATS, INTERFACE WITH THE SPECTATORS AND WATCH OUR DISPLAYED BOATS. Entrance fees are \$10 for day passes or \$15 for a pass for both days. Military Passes are available for \$5

SCALE COMPETITION IS OPEN TO OUR MEMBERS. Entry fee is \$5/boat and INCLUDES a \$10 day pass for Sunday. Classes for boats are: Military, Work, Pleasure and Racing. Cash prizes for 1st place winners are \$25 and \$100 for best of show. For more information visit http://www.nwmhe.com/

Models to be entered can be brought in without a pass as early as 6 am on Saturday. With your \$5 entry fee you get a free pass for Sunday.

HERE IS A TIP: Enter a boat for scale judging for \$5, Bring in your boat Saturday and get a fee Sunday pass to use when you pick up your boat and enjoy the show or run your boats all for the \$5 entry fee for the scale competition.

Ed Maurer was present and accompanied by his son. He brought along a box full of goodies to sell, most of which was scarfed up at the break.

Mel brought in several boxes of nautical books he acquired from a Stone Way bookstore and encouraged all of us to take some before being dropped off at Half Priced Books or the dumpster.

Show and tell started with **Bill Heath** bringing items he wished to sell, most acquired from Harbor Models.

Doug Wilson brought in the model he is working on and explained how he was filling the cracks between planks with a filling compound and then how it appeared after sanding. The process required a second coat to complete the finish.





Kevan Nolet showed progress he has made

with his Coast Guard model having recently finished with the hull painting and placing gauges he acquired from Pine Wood Derby kits.





Masaaki Seki explained how he glued the hull halves of his submarine model together and what glue he used. He will be placing fiberglass tape to strengthen the joints.





Robert Osmond demonstrated several items he recently purchased from Wish.com, namely a silicone soldering mat and soldering iron with a clamp tip and spool of solder. He is cutting grating from a kitchen grease spatter absorber. He also purchased a spool of easy line (stretchable) from Showcase Miniatures stating that it is much better for rigging than the stretchy thread one buys at sewing stores. In addition to all this he is updating all the electronics for

his Caldercraft Clyde Puffer to include a pulsating diesel sound system actuated by a magnet on the shaft, a horn, bells and seagull sounds which will run on six volts. He also will have a smoke generator and I believe

he purchased these items from Horizon Hobbies. He recently purchased a seal version of the new Riverine Patrol Boat.




The financial report was given and expenses explained. Considerable discussion followed regarding the December dinner with a lot of constructive advice.
