


Meeting Minutes – June 3, 2021 By "Doc" Ron Bray

Sixteen faces appeared on zoom which proceeded despite technical difficulties with our commodore's computer system, which was finally rectified by his son **John**. **Lee Buse** asked if there were any simple kits or plans similar to the Springer model but larger. The Dumas Shelly Foss kit was mentioned but the feeling of the group was that a model similar to **Mel Suelzle's** Red Bull was probably more appropriate. **Allan Wing** showed his model similar to Mel's with kort nozzles. **Keith Schermerhorn** added that plans for a truckable grocery boat like Mel and Allan's could



be found in the archives of one of the older magazines. **Bryan Morse** suggested building a Dumas Lord Nelson model.





Keith Schermerhorn showed progress for his Titan and commented on the deck supports for his carrier model allowing for access to motors, batteries and electronics.











Steve Sunich showed the completed deck of his cruiser model stating he used some 800 pieces to complete the project. He found a source for Pitman motors – Server Source Components. Apparently, they have a variety of motor sizes and even though they don't look like Pitman's, the name Pitman is on the motor. He showed the two that he purchased with delivery in two weeks.





John McCool bought a fast ready to run speed boat and is anxious to see how it performs at the fun float this Saturday.





Mel Suelzle commented on how difficult it was to build the net reel for his tuna boat and that he is uncertain how to construct the rigging as there is no similar plan for these boats.










Mel showed the spring- loaded contacts allowing power to be directed to the superstructure. These can be purchased from All Electrics, catalog item number SLC-5 and only cost 85 cents each. They come on a circuit board and excess need to be removed before mounting on the model.







The Great Photo Credit goes to Paul Williams our newsletter editor and Zoom photo chief. Mel told us that building materials like Evergreen plastics and Midwest woods can be purchased at Hobby Lobby as well as metals.

The subject of vinyl graphics was discussed at some length. As Callie Graphics has a 6- week backlog, Vinyl Lab NW in Mukilteo could fit the bill, their number is 425-870-8702.

The fact that trophy plaques have become so expensive and backlogged, it was suggested that we pursue whether or not we should consider dash plaques instead, at a much more reasonable cost. Most plaques most often end up in drawers or lying around on a shelf or table. It was unanimously voted to pursue looking into the dash plaque possibility. The meeting then concluded at 2035.

Fun Float and Springer Event Reports - June 5

All went well for this year's Springer Event. The course was a challenge to guide a Springer with a barge in tow and pushing a soccer ball around a generally triangular course marked by two pylons and ending at a finish line gate 4 feet wide, without any part of the rig touching a marker or the gate.

Any touch was a disqualifier and judged DNF (Did Not Finish). The shortest time to complete the course determined the event winner. It was an exciting and challenging Springer Event designed by **Dave Green**.





It consisted of pushing a soccer ball with the front of the tug while pulling my barge full of water away from the shore and around two buoys and through a gate. When the stern of the barge went through the gate the timing was ended.





There were 10 runs for score. Five completed the course, each with some very, very close passages at the finish line. The other five were fine until either the finish line approach or actual passage through the finish line gate. Overall each operator did very well on the first two legs of the course (no lost balls and barge control improved as they advanced). The head wind on the final leg proved to be a challenge on the final as it was pretty fluky and likely the cause of most DNF's.

Event winner was **Mel Suelzle** as he edged out Robert Osmond by a giant 1 and 59/100 seconds. All finishers, except one time were within a 9 second time span.

John McCool tried his hand at the event and had a slight incident with the line and the underwater winch on Dave Green's Springer.





There were other captains operating with underwater winches as well. **Mel Suelzle** won the event with a very good time, and now gets to come up with a fall Springer Event. If you win you, you get to design the next Springer Event Task.













Allan Wing ran his "Red Terror" brushless powered springer through the course while pulling the barge so fast that the barge submerged and the water was running over the top and back off the stern (the barge will not sink). He probably has the most powerful springer in the club hands down.













We will anxiously look forward to Mel's Fall Springer Spectacular (no pressure).
