Our monthly meeting was held on July 6. There were 22 persons in attendance.

It started promptly with Steve Sunich giving an overview of the winners of the June Model Boat Regatta.





discussed the issue of our club's average age and mortality. The Fisherman's Fall Festival is now scheduled for September 30.


Show and tell was great, as usual.

Of course, **Robert Osmond** brought a ton of stuff and knowledge to the meeting. He opened with talking about adhesives. He showed us Weld-On 1802 which is a solvent type of thick glue that works on several different types of plastic, acrylic, styrene, expanded PVC (Sintra), ABS and Butrate. It will also glue them to each other. No other glue will do this. It is available from Amazon, but not TAP Plastics or any local supplier. Interestingly, this does not attach or affect plastic medical syringes so that they can be used to apply the glue.





Robert also brought along his Dumas Carol Moran model. He added a Graupner gear drive, Prop shop propeller, steerable Kort nozzle.





He replaced some of the material that came with the kit like the material for the cabin walls with 1/32 inch styrene which can make the curves with ease. He also replaced deck support strips with 1/8 by 1/8 styrene. Since the kit uses styrene and expanded pvc (Sintra) he used Weld-On 1802 (see info above) as adhesive.





Chris Merrill showed us his beautiful River Patrol Boat (RTB). He was trying to get it to ballast correctly with magnets holding the ballast. It also had a neat electrical

connection from the cabin to deck for lights.







Brian Morse showed a simple trick with manicurist nail files. They have a nice sphere tip on them so that you can paint small dots, like rivets. Sometimes the simple things are the best.







Steve Sunich brought his super yacht model to show his lack of progress since the last time he showed it off. He has done the hull paint and some wood trim. He is working on the underwater lights. He did not want to use Krylon paint but it was the only paint that had the perfect color. He was pleasantly surprised at how well it went on. There

were no run problems. Since it allows second coats in one minute, it was easy to go around the boat and back again in about a minute. Therefore, it covered nicely with one application. However, it does not seem very tough as it marks easily. Maybe it will harden as time goes on.

Fun Float July 8

The Fun Float of July 8, 2023 at the Bellevue Downtown Park's pond had a very good turnout of members and visitors. We enjoyed some great summer weather with warm temperatures, not windy and light clouds, so



shade from tents was not needed. By my count, there were at least 21 members and a few new folks (see group photo). **Robert Osborn** set up some gates to practice for the upcoming Tugboat Regatta in August. He also had barges for folks to use if they did not bring their own.













In addition, one of our long time members **Patrick Pluear** came and setup a set of foam lighted buoys for more objects to navigate around. I had also transported the club's set of buoys, but saw they were not needed.

As a club greeter, I was glad to spend a little time with a new member **Robert Newell**. He came with a scratch built 23 inch runabout, a beautiful dark blue and green craft with open cockpit that carried a Disney character "Joe" that many children recognized.







This was his first real shakedown run and Robert Newell commented to me that he wanted to add some weight to his boat. I had my blue heliport barge and accessories, which included a variety of fishing weights and towing lines. He tested a couple of combinations and found a set that worked well. Since they were marked, he will be able to duplicate and fabricate that ballast.









The fun float event attracted many different crafts. I had my new RTR River Patrol Boat that was part of the July monthly meeting show and share on using strong magnetics to hold ballast in place in the stern. It worked well and went into a good plane level at 2/3 throttle, no further adjustments were needed. My quick notes taken had at least 10 tugboats or springers, 8 barges, 2 sailboats, 4 pleasure crafts, 2 jet boats and 2 military crafts. Photos were taken at water level by Robert's Go Pro camera along with at least two other members.

Thanks to those that provided their pictures for our newsletter. Hope to see you all in August at the Tug Boat Regatta on 5th and Twilight Float on 16th.
