The president mentioned that the website is being set up to have a "members only" section which will only be available by password. More on this will be coming soon.

Show & Tell brought Bob Wickham to the front to tell us about the "kit bashing" he is doing to a 41' Coast Guard patrol boat to make it a 61'. He has added six inches in the middle, added a motor and canted the outboard rudders. There are more changes to come!

Mike Gullikson showed his 36' Dumas Coast Guard life boat which he has finished planking and is starting to add the deck details.

Tom Stevens showed us a large barge which has a crane and other machinery on it. Tom is in the process of adapting a transmitter to it. The whole rig was purchased from John Pineau from B.C

Phil Northrup showed a book on world battleships and their size relationship to one another. He also shared a source for LEDs he had found.

Because Phil inquired about the search for a new lake being done by Dain Webster, Lee gave a short report on what has transpired to date. The meeting was adjourned at 7:48




Tips & Tricks

As we get less flexible, getting our boats in and out of the water can become more of a challenge. Our good friend from California, **Keith Lingscheid**, has sent us a method he has come up with to solve the problem. Many of us have great helps to solve problems, share them with us.

Sailboat Launcher

I made this sailboat launcher, to aid in getting my sailboat in and out of the pond. It's made of 1/2" EMT, welded together. I used shrink-tube to prevent scratching up the boat, instead of rubber hose. The real trick is getting the right size. It has to be big enough to fit under the boat, around the keel, and yet small enough to fit in the boat stand. This allows you to pick up the boat from the stand, and place it in the water. You can also remove the launcher from the stand, when you don't need it, by sliding it out from the bottom of the stand.

The stand is also made of 1/2" EMT. My wife made the straps. It's a lot better than the imported stick stand, that came with the boat.
