July has been a very exciting time as we zero in on our Regatta plan; handle all of the modeling tools and materials donated by

With the recent "Grand Reopening of the Downtown park and meetings with park officials, we have a definite course of action with only a few issues remaining to be resolved. commitment from the park management to hold our Regatta on August 5th as long as we are willing to accept some changes or restrictions. Dave Green and I are working to sort out what these changes will be and integrate them in our 2017 regatta plan. We may run our regatta from a new location; our parking will be plentiful but not as convenient to the pond as before. All of these details will be sorted out and communicated to everyone during July. Plenty of time for final adjustments. Robert Osmond and Al Kinsman are working hard on a new challenging navigation course that is flexible should our running position change. Donations are rolling in for our raffle. We expect even more before August 5th. While some prizes will be raffled at the end of the day, most will be tickets drawn throughout the day that are good for a wide variety of prizes. This simplifies the process, allows winners to choose from a wide selection and minimizes the time for a normal raffle process at the end of a long and hopefully hot day.

We will continue the KISS system for our regatta scoring and judging process. This worked well last year and only minor changes are planned. We will try and ease the workload for all. Like last year, computers are banned as all scoring and reporting will be done

using a simplified registration and score management system using the latest and most advanced technology that clipboards can provide. Gone are the days (unless next year's prez decides otherwise) when someone has to spend all day typing information in a computer while covered in a black hood on a hot day at the pond. I feel it's far better to minimize the administrative process and make it a fund day for everyone!!

Last month I mentioned that positive results will be found in this year's frustrating scheduling process with the absence of access to the Bellevue Pond. Clearly one benefit is discovery of the Seattle Yacht Club as more than just a place to run one day during opening week of the boating season. Some of this year's best fun floats have been at this location. Our July fun float was no exception. An excellent turnout of members, new and old on a beautiful day. 
