Dr. Ron showed his Billings kit of the *Calypso* and described some of the modified items and strength and weaknesses of this kit.

Nominations were entertained for next year's slate of officers. Ed Maurer was nominated for secretary-treasurer, **Robert Osmond** for vice president and **Bob Jacobsen** for president. There being no other nominations, all were unanimously elected. The fun float this Sunday will be at the Lake Union pond since the Bellevue pond has been drained.

After the break Ed announced that there are 23 registered for the Christmas dinner. Tom Stevens started the show and tell by bringing in a large Uniflite model he purchased from the **Jack Spore** estate. He showed it as it is now and will be doing a

lot of work upgrading it in the near future and will bring it in to show these nuances. This may be the only pleasure boat model with Kort nozzles which may or may not be present in the future. Mel demonstrated the function of his new Dimension Engineering speed control mixer which has been installed in his Southampton tug. With this new device one can control the forward, backward and turning with one joy stick on the transmitter, He is using the elevator, aileron channels for the task. Someone mentioned the club purchasing a couple of these Southampton tugs for the kids to run at our events and hopefully encouraging them to consider our hobby. **Phil Northrup** showed his handmade props for the Southampton and described how to make them. He then sold them to Bob Jacobsen.

The meeting concluded at 2015 after a lot of stimulating discussions.

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A Letter From Kevin Klocke

The information pertaining to why the pond will not be present at the 2012 Pacific Maritime Expo that was published in the October 2012 Bilge Pump is incorrect.

I would like to set the story straight with the real reasons that the pond will not be present.

With the football stadium at the University of Washington being torn down and rebuilt, all home Husky football games are being played at the CLINK (QWEST Center). This limits the dates available that include Saturdays, which is why the PME dates were changed to the end of November and the beginning of the week. The dates would normally have been the 15 thru the 17 of November; instead the dates for 2012 are the 27, 28 and 29th. This now ends 5 days prior to the Work Boat Show in Louisiana starts. (both shows are run by the same management company). This has left many vendors deciding not to participate at PME due to the difficulties in getting equipment and personnel moved to Louisiana in time for the next event. PME does not make any money with the presence of the pond, we are merely entertainment. If you go onto the PME website and look at the floor plan, you will notice where the pond was in 2011 is now designated as vendor space. The PME is trying to make up for the possibility of lost revenue from the vendors that may not be participating this year.

With this being stated PME cut the floor space for the pond, but gave Fat Cat RC Marine the option to purchase this space at our own cost (last years cost was \$4000 for this space and 2012 cost would be higher). In contacting the show coordinator they had decided that with or without a sponsor that they were not going to have the pond this year. As I already stated the PME needs to make revenue and the pond does not do that for them.


It was also stated that I could not get sponsorship for the pond. This information is not correct. I had been working with the Port of Seattle, Western Towboat, Markey Winch and JonRie Intertech all of which were very interested in helping with sponsorship of the pond. With all this being said by the time that we were informed that there was no space at the PME for the pond; we were told that it was too late for us to get the needed sponsorship for this space.

I appreciate all support form the club members last year and hope that we will be back at the PME in 2013.




Construction **Techniques**

Modelers spend many hours in the workshop building and assembling their models. Some enjoy this work; others accept it as a necessary evil. Here are some tips that will help take the toil out of the task.




FUEL-LINE AND WATER-LINE RETAINERS

Plastic and rubber lines sometimes slide off pipes. Cut short pieces of the line and slip them over the top by stretching them with hemostats or long-nose pliers. These pieces will contract and pinch the lines into position.




QUICK-RELEASE HATCH

Glue a wooden block into your boat's hull, then drill and tap it for a nylon screw. Remove the head of the screw, and drill its shank to accept an R/C car body clip. The hatch should be pressed down so that it lightly compresses the rubber gasket. Install a rubber washer under the body clip so that it doesn't scratch your paint.



WATER-RESISTANT HATCH

If your deck hatch is held down with pieces of Velcro® tape, water can seep into the radio/engine compartment when the boat turns sharply or goes astern. To solve this problem, fill the gaps between the Velcro® pieces with foam draft excluder (see arrow). When the hatch is pressed down, it will form a tight seal.




GREASING GUTS

Disassemble the strut and propeller shaft, then drill a 1/a-inch hole in the side of the shaft bushing. Solder a short piece of 1/s-inch brass tube into an automotive grease nipple, and then snap this onto a grease gun. A couple of squeezes of the grease-gun lever will be enough to drive out water and old grease and inject fresh **Jubricant**



POSITIONING HARD-TO-REACH NUTS

Wrap a strip of masking tape around your index finger with the sticky side facing out. A nut or washer that's stuck to the tape is easy to position.



CAVITATION CURE

Prop cavitation is similar to a slipping clutch in a car-lots of revs but no "go"! Air bubbles around your boat's prop cause a tremendous loss in efficiency. Many full-size boats have anti-cavitation plates, and you can make one for your model out of thin metal. Epoxy it to the strut as close to the propeller arc as possible. Your boat's performance will be greatly improved!
