October Minutes by Dr. Ron Bray

Commodore **Lee Stewart** brought 24 swabbies to order at 1900 hours. Upcoming events were announced and discussed and are listed elsewhere in the newsletter. There will be no participation this year at the Pacific Marine Expo as the space was rented out before a sponsor could be secured. **Mike King** was introduced and joined the club. He resides in Edmonds and has been a member of the San Francisco Model Yacht Club, before moving to the Northwest

Members were encouraged to bring their new models to the meeting next month to be judged by **Mike Shaw** for the "Best Build of 2012 Award" to be presented at the December meeting. Nomination and election of officers will be held at next month's meeting. **Ed Maurer** has agreed to continue on as treasurer. President and Vice-President are open for contention.

Considerable discussion regarding the **Cliff Shaw Award** was entertained and in the end it was finally voted to continue this on a yearly basis, with some revision of the parameters by the award committee. A discussion to rename the spring regatta to the Northwest R/C/ Ship Modelers' Cliff Shaw Memorial Regatta was tabled for discussion next year.

Mel Suelzle brought **Tom Steven's** Springer and radio for auction as it was left behind at the Springer competition at Bob Jacobsen's last month. The batteries were dead as the boat and radio had not been switched off. Lee started the bidding at \$100 but negotiated with Tom so he could reclaim them.

Dave Green discussed purchasing raffle tickets for an automobile, to be drawn at the upcoming car show, to raise funds for Medic One. Donations fund the emergency vehicles, the personnel and eight months of training for Medic One. Survival by heart attack victims is attributed to the fast actions of these well trained professionals and approaches 50% versus only 3-5% for other metropolitan centers.

Ed Maurer asked that members send their money in for the Christmas dinner by the next meeting, as the caterer needs an accurate accounting. The cost is \$44 a person and will be \$50 for after December 1st.

Dain Webster announced that the buoys brought in for judging will placed on the table at the break and he will give out ballots for the members to vote for their first and second choice of the best buoy build.

After the break, while Dain was tallying the votes, the Show and Tell items were discussed, Dave White brought in some really cool small geared motors which can be purchased from Phil's Narrow Gauge website. Dave will provide the link to **Mike Jones** for placement on our website. Our new member, Mike King, discussed his highly detailed Soviet missile destroyer, a kit with directions only in Chinese, which he purchased while in China. Since he is on the road a lot, he asked for help in building a six foot RC square rigger kit. So, if anyone can help, feel free to contact him. **Dr. Ron Bray** presented his finished Danish frigate, a Billings kit which he stated was a vast improvement over some of their older kits. The ABS hull was a bit thicker and the wood parts delicately cut by laser technology. As with other kits there were a number of brass fittings to facilitate the build. He noted that the two motors revved at different rpms, a problem later solved by Mel by adjusting the output percentages in the Spektrum DX6 radio. Bob Wickham discussed his tsunami buoy with a flashing LED activated by a tip 120 transistor and electrodes, when placed in water. While still waiting for the tally, Tom Stevens discussed painting his truck with the HVLP paint gun he bought from Mel at the auction last month. He used two part automotive urethane paint and described difficulty cleaning the paint gun once the paint kicked off. Dain brought in the results of the buoy voting. A tie was noted for first place so going to the second choice votes was able to break the tie. Bob Wickham won first and second and Brian Morse came in third. Dain will take them home and modify them to Coast Guard standards and electrify them for night use.. They will be set up at the next fun float so that we can practice for the night float during daylight hours.

After another colorful evening the meeting concluded at 2020 hours and everyone said their goodbyes and headed for their home ports.
